The King of the Jews (Mark 15)

The term "king of the Jews" has not appeared in Mark. In chapter 15, the term appears six times. Here are six words to describe what Mark is presenting through using the term "King of the Jews."

- I. Acknowledged. (Vss. 2-8)
 - A. The truth is spoken by a non-believer.
 - B. The truth is confirmed by the ultimate source.
- II. Contempt. (Vss. 9-11)
 - A. The sarcasm of one who doesn't care.
 - B. The contempt of those who are envious.
- III. Guilty. (Vss. 12-15)
 - A. The judgement on the Jews.
 - B. The responsibility of the Romans. (Pilate)
- IV. Mockery. (Vss. 16-21)
 - A. The political fallacy.
 - B. The spiritual insanity.
- V. Proclamation. (Vss. 22-31)
 - A. The charges of the ignorant.
 - B. The claim of the Savior.
- VI. MESSIAH!! (Vss. 32-47)
 - A. The truth is acknowledged by a Roman centurion.
 - B. The truth is modeled by disciples of Jesus.
