

Sermon Notes – June 29, 2025

Redeemed by God's Grace Through Christ's Blood (Ephesians 1:7)

Text: Ephesians 1:7 - "In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace."

- I. The Need for Redemption
 - A. Redemption implies a price for freedom. (I Corinthians 6:19-20) (Matthew 20:28)
 - B. People were enslaved to sin and Satan, unable to free themselves. (Ephesians 2:1-3)
 - C. "Bondage" refers to spiritual death and isolation from God due to sin. We are separated, cut off from God. We are enemies of and hostile to God (Romans 8:6-7) (James 4:3-5) (Colossians 2:13)
- II. The Necessities for Redemption
 - A. Redemption is accomplished by His blood (Hebrews 9:22) (1 Peter 1:19)
 - B. Christ's sacrificial death on the cross. Was the means by which God could justly forgive us of our sins "Propitiation" (Romans 3-23-26) (1 Peter 2:24)
 - C. Old Testament sacrifices foreshadowed Christ's ultimate sacrifice. Forgiveness of sins cannot be done without the shedding of blood. (Genesis 3:21) (Leviticus 16:11-22; Leviticus 17:11)
- III. The Riches of His Grace
 - A. Redemption and forgiveness come "according to the riches of His grace". (Romans 3:24) (Colossians 1:27)
 - B. Indicates abundant grace, not earned by human merit. It is a gift! (Ephesians 2:8-9)
 - C. Forgiveness is free and full, encompassing past, present, and future sins.
 - (1 Corinthians 1:30) (Ephesians 4:30) (Acts 2:38-39)
